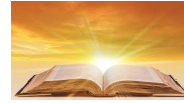

### Wisdom from the Pews

Today's Gospel is breathless in its call to action: Rise! Flee! Take! Depart! Mary and Joseph, their lives already turned upside down by their "yeses" to God, begin parenthood amidst persecution, fear, and flight. Living under the rule of a brutal dictator who is seeking their child, the danger is real and imminent, and affects not only them. While today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, on December 28th we typically celebrate the Feast of the Holy Innocents, the infants who were murdered by Herod in defense of his own power.

Having sung "Silent Night, Holy Night" a mere three days ago, it can be tempting to equate "holiness" with "peacefulness." We might look at our nativities, icons, and statues of Joseph, Mary and the infant Christ in their stillness, and feel they are set apart from us and the challenges we face, trying to navigate our own families through busy days and confusing times. But the Holy Family, held up on this Feast as a "true model of life," was not shielded from challenges or apprehensions. In fact, they are now immigrants, refugees, dependent on God and the mercy of others for survival, like so many of our brothers and sisters in the world today.

So if the holiness of our holy family is not rooted in being "set apart," what is it rooted in? In today's Gospel, what we witness in Joseph is a deep listening to God's voice (even in his dreams!) and an embrace of God's plan, followed by action: "**He rose, took the child and his mother, and went...**"! Joseph and Mary grew up as devout Jews in the

hills of Israel, praying the psalms and celebrating Sabbath time consecrated to God. Our holy family's holiness is born of their faith, as individuals and within their community. It is grounded in their close relationship with God, and revealed in the trust they show in God's voice.

We, too, are invited to this kind of holiness, for as Saint Paul says in our first reading, we, too, are "**God's chosen ones, holy and beloved.**" He also tells us where to start: "**Brothers and Sisters, put on... heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another...**" Will we do this perfectly? Not a chance. Will we always love as we wish to? Unlikely. We are human. But we do know that Christ, who lived his earthly life raised within this human and holy family, will hallow our efforts as we grow in love with him.

### Make a Year-end Donation to St. Ignatius Parish!

"Giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light." (Colossians 1:12)

If you are age 73 or older, the IRS requires you to take required minimum distributions each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. A qualified charitable donation (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable directly to a qualified charity such as St. Ignatius Parish. As 2025 draws to a close, please consider making a year-end donation to help us maintain and care for our beautiful church. A charitable IRA rollover is an easy way to make a gift to St. Ignatius Parish to help us grow our endowment.

You can directly transfer any amount up to \$100,000 from your IRA and pay no income tax on the distribution, while making a charitable donation to our parish.

- You must be 70<sup>1/2</sup> or older.
- The transfer must go directly from your IRA to St. Ignatius.
