TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

You Are The Coin Of God

Dear Parishioners:

The “Caesar saying” in Matthew’s gospel today is one of Jesus’ most famous remarks. As we approach the national election in these contentious times, now is a chance to reflect on how Jesus deals with religious practice and politics.

The coinage in question bore the image of the Roman emperor, who was called a god. As a graven image of a false god, it contravened the second commandment. Jewish money changers set up booths outside the Temple precincts because offensive Roman coins had to be exchanged for Temple shekels. Jews could only purchase lambs for sacrifice with Temple shekels.

The irony is that Jewish authorities compromised themselves and their religious principles when they rendered service to a false deity in distant Rome by trafficking in money exchange. Jesus’ response is a reminder that there is a huge gap between Caesar’s realm and God’s realm. No one can serve two masters. One god instigates the suffering and death of Jesus, while the true God achieves the real victory – new life, resurrection.

When a foreign power occupies your country, you have three choices: fight them every step of the way; join them; or give them as little as necessary so you can get on with your life. In occupied Israel, some Jews refused to pay taxes to Caesar, some grudgingly paid to avoid persecution, and some (like Matthew) actually collected taxes for Caesar.

Jesus had the same three choices as his neighbors had. He would not betray his own people by helping Caesar tax them. And he did not want to muddy his primary mission by getting side-tracked over a false dichotomy – whether you could be a good Jew and still pay taxes.



Jesus turned the question into a “teachable moment.” ***Just as you give Caesar his due, so you should give God his due.*** It seems to settle the matter. But a further question remains unanswered. If the *tax* belongs to Caesar, *what belongs to God?* Does all of your money that is left after taxes belong to God? A biblical tithe? Or whatever remains after you have taken care of all your other priorities?

Scholars say that the coin offered to Jesus probably had the image of the reigning emperor, Tiberius. Minting coinage in your own image was an act of sovereignty. Each successive emperor would begin his reign by destroying the currency of his predecessor in order to replace it with his own.

When Jesus tells his followers to pay their taxes, he reinforced the allegiance every good citizen owes to temporal authority. Believers are to perform their civic duties and pay their taxes, however difficult these may be. "Whose image is stamped on the coin?" "Caesar's." "Then it must belong to Caesar: but whose image is stamped on you?" "God's." "Then you must belong to God."

Think of what it means to belong to God – bearing the image of God. When God decided to have a life outside the Trinity, God in Jesus expressed the divine image in a human person. You and I are human persons, too – numbered, autographed, limited-edition images of God. That you "*reflect* God" as God's image is not just a legal fiction – it is authenticated by divine DNA. In light of this divine identity, what do you owe God?

Some think that today's advice from Jesus justifies a variety of political theories regarding the secular and the sacred worlds. Remember the medieval "two-sword" theory, or the "throne and altar" theology of Luther, or the separation of church and state in the American constitution? Jesus did not mean that religion and politics have to be in separate boxes. He challenges his followers to be the salt, the light, and the leaven that will unite and sanctify both worlds. All your talents and wealth and health are at the service of blessing your fellow human beings.

What does it mean that you are an authentic image of God – a personal, non-transferable passion of God? What does that imply? It means that you can hold nothing back, keep no spare change for private use. The divine image engraved on you makes you more precious than gold, unrepeatable unique, destined for enjoyment of communion with Unapproachable Light without end. Amen.

Did you hear the wonderful news this week that Fr. Greg Boyle, SJ, and Homeboy industries was awarded the Hilton Humanitarian prize, the world's largest humanitarian award, for alleviating human suffering? The recognition specifically called out not only the difference made in their community of L.A., but that they had changed the model for being with people on the margins around the world.

At the school this year, we are walking very closely with Fr. Boyle's ideas of Radical Kinship and how to build inclusive community. The faculty and staff read his book "Barking to the Choir" over the summer and the School Advisory Commission is reading it now. Their Dolores Mission school is one of only 25 surviving elementary schools like ours that was founded by the Jesuits.

One of the hallmarks that draws people to our parish school is a great focus of Ignatian spirituality: unity. It is even more critical in these days of distance learning and isolation to make sure that everyone is included and that kindness is a value. Students will begin to understand this year that they find their identity and strength in exercising Radical Kinship: it is an expansive and abundant way to be in the world.

In this tense time of pandemic, election and economic upheaval, it seems an increasingly tricky task to find and cultivate common ground and commit to the common good. It is gratifying that our students already have this as a core practice: we are all one in Christ.

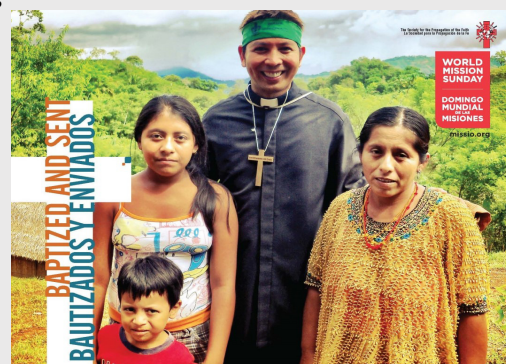

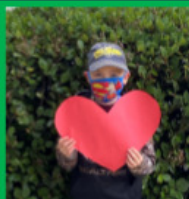
