# Wisdom from the Pews

Today's passages remind us of the unwavering love, mercy, and protection that God extends to His faithful ones. The reading from the Book of Wisdom assures us that those who trust in God, even in suffering, are in His hands and will find peace. Though the world may see death as the end, for the faithful, it is the beginning of eternal life. This is a powerful reminder that our suffering, trials, and losses are not in vain. Like gold purified in the fire, God allows us to be tested so that we may be worthy of His kingdom.

Psalm 23 beautifully echoes this message of trust in God's guidance. "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want." These words give us confidence that, no matter the struggles we face, God is always with us, leading us to rest and renewal. Even when we walk through dark valleys—whether grief, uncertainty, or hardship—we are not alone. His rod and staff give us courage, reminding us that our lives are held in His care.

Paul's letter to the Romans further deepens our understanding of God's love. Christ died for us not because we were righteous, but because of His boundless mercy. His sacrifice is the ultimate proof of love—love that redeems us, justifies us, and reconciles us with God. Because of this, we live in hope, a hope that never disappoints.

Finally, in the Gospel of John, Jesus

Wisdom 3:1-9 Romans 5:5-11 John 6:37-40



assures us that He will never reject anyone who comes to Him. His mission is clear: to fulfill the Father's will and to bring eternal life to all who believe in Him. This promise is one of the most profound sources of comfort in our faith. No matter how lost or unworthy we may feel, Christ welcomes us with open arms and promises that He will never abandon

These readings, taken together, invite us to trust deeply in God's plan, to find peace in His presence, and to live with the hope of eternal life. They remind us that suffering is temporary, but God's love and promises are eternal.

For me, these words hold special meaning when I think of my own faith journey here at St. Ignatius. I grew up in this parish community—attended school here, was married here, and had my children baptized and educated here. Both of my parents were laid to rest from this very church, and now I am blessed to work at the school that shaped my own faith. Through all the seasons of my life—joy, loss, hope, and renewal—this community and God's Word have been my constant reminder that we are never alone. God's presence truly endures from generation to generation, guiding and comforting us every step of the way.



will begin in January 2026, offering an opportunity for you to



- \* The transfer must go directly from your IRA to St. Ignatius.


