## Wisdom from the Pews

Just three weeks ago, in the 12th chapter of Luke, Jesus had this to say: "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. From now on a household of five will be divided, three against two and two against three; a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother, a mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law."

And this Sunday, in the 14th chapter of Luke, Jesus appears to be doubling down on family division: "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple..." Strong words for those of us who believe Jesus and the Christian faith are "pro-family."

These two weekends we bump into some tough and tricky Gospel passages that require us to apply a strong dose of context! These passages are meant to shock us and to force us to take a deeper look at our community connections (family, friends, groups, businesses, social media, nations, political parties, governments, and YES, even churches) to assess if we are building/ participating in a "false community" or in an "authentic community" like the one Jesus modeled and was building as he walked on Earth some 2000 years ago.

"False community" is rooted in

division, independence, mistrust, blame, shame, indifference, apathy, violence.

"Authentic community" is rooted in connection, interdependence, belonging, trust, mercy, love, compassion, empathy, and radical non-violence.

"False community" cares primarily about protecting itself, its power and its image.

"Authentic community" cares only about protecting the most vulnerable no matter the cost, including losing all of your power (sometimes that cost is a cross equaling powerlessness: "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple...").

"False community" cares that only the loudest or most powerful voices are heard.

"Authentic community" cares that ALL voices are heard.

Jesus came to root out and destroy not families, but to dismantle and destroy false communities. And Jesus did not come to dismantle and destroy those false communities by violent force, but instead to build and model "authentic community" rooted in relationships of mutual concern for each other so that people will be drawn to the Light of these communities by the fruit (of the Spirit) they produce.

"Authentic community" holds the life and soul of every human being as

sacred and worth caring for. "Authentic community" does not cancel people, but instead forgives them and invites them again and again into a deeper and more authentic relationship of mutual love and trust.


Disconnection is a plague on our society in this moment of history. And many peddlers of "false community" (some sadly claiming to be "Christian") are attempting to lure us into their fake "communities" built upon the mutual hatred and scapegoating of others. The antidote to this plague, and our path to discipleship with Jesus, is the building of "authentic community." Community rich in meaningful connections, built around an ever-increasing table of belonging for all, especially the most vulnerable in our world.


#### Make a Year-end Donation to St. Ignatius Parish!

If you are age 73 or older, the IRS requires you to take required minimum distributions each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. A qualified charitable donation (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable directly to a qualified charity such as St. Ignatius Parish. As 2025 draws to a close, please consider making a year-end donation to help us take care of our beautiful church. A charitable IRA rollover is an easy way to make a gift to St. Ignatius Parish to help us grow our endowment.

You can directly transfer any amount up to \$100,000 from your IRA and pay no income tax on the distribution, while making a charitable donation to our parish.

- \* You must be  $70^{1/2}$  or older.
- \* The transfer must go directly from your IRA to St. Ignatius.

#### ST. IGNATIUS SCHOOL




