Wisdom from the Pews

Ever since childhood, I've been fascinated with fire, and this week's lectionary has me thinking about the incandescent nature of the Holy Spirit. For so much of my life, I've felt that my shortcomings and faults distanced me from God—as if that could actually happen! This week's readings remind that I am a child of God, burning bright as any wildfire:

"Though I am afflicted and poor, yet the Lord thinks of me" Psalm (40:17)

I used to be plagued by a spiritual gap. While I knew God thought of me, I felt estranged from Him. Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10 reminds me that even the wisest struggle, and his burdened solitude echos the doubts that keep me disconnected from God's passionate fire. Since joining our parish last year, I feel a curious flame, drawing closer to a relationship with God.

Fire also has a destructive and purifying side that illuminates a



double-meaning of the Holy Spirit to destroy the old ways and purify the new:



Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10 Hebrews 12:1-4 Luke 12:49-53

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" (Luke 12:49)

"Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the Earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." (Luke 12:51)

Are these the words of Jesus Christ, 'The Prince of Peace,' 'The Good Shepherd,' the 'Light of the World?' This was not the touchy-feely-lovey-dovey Jesus of my 1970s youth. Jesus was a rabble-rouser who upset the status quo with his message of an everlasting covenant between God and his diverse people. Such a bold, fiery message was bound to sow division in the ancient world.

As I draw closer to my spiritual flame, I see the divisiveness Jesus mentions between those who are threatened by my faith and the invitation to draw closer to God's fire. Psalm 40 reminds us that the Holy Spirit "...draws me up from the pit of destruction, out of the muddy clay, sets my feet upon rock, steadies my steps to put a new song in my mouth, a hymn to our God."

As I reflect on this week's lectionary, I notice Jesus "wishes" the passionate fire of the Holy Spirit to descend upon Earth. Jesus wishes this because we are called to light our hearts afire with the Holy Spirit. And in that way we all can rabble rouse and challenge the status quo within and without our hearts.




