

### A Message from the Pastor

Clint Eastwood is ninety-two years old. Perhaps this grizzled actor demonstrates to us that when we hit the age of sixty, there can be a “rebirth,” a resurrection of creativity, of accomplishment, of life. Think of the list of films that this man has directed in the last thirty years—Unforgiven, Million Dollar Baby, Flags of Our Fathers, Letters from Iwo Jima, Changeling, Invictus, Grand Torino, The Changeling, the Mule, and Hereafter.



Is it all that strange that an artist, towards the end of his life, would work on a project like Hereafter that explores the question “Is there life after death”? In other words, is there resurrection? If we have ever been by the bedside of a dying parent, if we have ever experienced a serious accident or life-threatening illness, if we have ever gotten a medical diagnosis that seemed to us like a “death sentence,” who of us has not asked ourselves that faith-defining question, “Is there life after death?”

Eastwood’s film has received mixed reviews. I, for one, enjoyed it. It made me think as I was watching it, and it continues to evoke reflection in me as I read this Sunday’s gospel. As I often pray, at a funeral Mass, in the words of the funeral Preface: “For those who love you, Lord, life is changed not ended.”

Every week, when we say the Creed together, we utter these words, “We believe in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.” We believe in the hope of the resurrection. We believe that Jesus suffered and died, but that he rose again on the third day. We believe that he has gone before us to prepare a place for us. It is this Easter faith that often consoles us when we have lost a loved one—the hope that one day we will be reunited with them where there will be no more suffering and no more tears.

A Jesuit classmate and close friend likes to conclude his cards, letters, and e-mails with this phrase: “Practice resurrection daily.” What does it mean to practice resurrection daily?

Wendell Berry, in his poem *Manifesto: The Mad Farmer Liberation Front*, writes,

So, friends, every day do something  
that won't compute. Love the Lord.  
Love the world. Work for nothing.  
Take all you have and be poor.  
Love someone who does not deserve it.  
Give your approval to all you cannot  
understand. Praise ignorance, for what man  
has not encountered he has not destroyed.  
Ask questions that have no answers.  
Invest in the millennium. Plant sequoias.  
Practice resurrection.

Every time I bring hope into a situation, every time I bring joy that shatters despair, every time I forgive others and give them back dignity and the possibility of a future with me and others in community, every time I listen to others and affirm them and their life, every time I speak the truth in public, every time I confront injustice—I practice resurrection.



May the God, whose love is stronger than death; may Jesus who proclaimed that he was “the way, the truth, and the life;” may the Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead and strengthens us to choose life, the blessing; may our Triune God help each and every one of us to practice resurrection daily.

## November ~ Virtue of the month

*November – the virtue of Generosity: The Call of the King*

*“Whoever wishes to come with me must labor with me.” Spiritual Exercise 95*

This is the month where we express thanksgiving, where we express gratitude. Last August, we explored the virtue of Gratitude:

*Gratitude is at the heart of the Spiritual Exercises-Ignatius asks us to ponder a Creator who created us out of love and who continues to create us each moment of our lives. Gratitude is intentional – perhaps we could see each day as a gift from a loving Creator, who desires to gift us and love us each day. Gratitude is a virtue that needs attention, so that we may remember the gift, as well as the giver and open our hearts in love and generosity.*

*All IS gift!*

Ignatius realized that when we develop and “exercise” the virtue of gratitude, we begin to live our lives with an attitude of abundance rather than scarcity. Ignatius asks us to pray for the grace to respond with generosity to the call from our loving Creator to labor and co-create with God so we can live a life of generous and loving service to those in need. <https://seelportland.org/>
