### A Message from the Pastor 2022

A long-time friend of mine from my days in Berkeley, Doug Adams, was dying of cancer some years ago. He was 60 years old. His wife Margo, another dear friend, had lost her fight with cancer two years earlier. Doug was the type of person who could walk into a dark room and light it up. Conversations with him animated and invigorated you. In a matter of minutes, he could go from being a complete stranger to being someone you trusted and considered a dear friend.

He moved from his home in Richmond—where he lived alone since his wife’s death—to Jackson, California, where he lived with a couple who were good friends. She was a Registered Nurse. All of Doug’s friends dreaded what was inevitable—the news of his death. And yet, when it came, it brought tears of joy. Doug died singing “To Dream the Impossible Dream” from the musical “Man of La Mancha.”

I don’t want to put more importance on a person’s last words than they deserve, but what a message Doug left us with this “swan song” of his. Final words, can tell us something about the person dying.

President John Quincy Adams’ last words were: “This is the last of earth! I am content.”

Famous Methodist Preacher

Henry Ward Beecher’s last words

were: “Now comes the mystery.”

Poet Heinrich Heine’s last words were:

“God will pardon me. That’s his line of

work.”

President Grover Cleveland’s

last words were: “I have tried so hard

to do the right.”

And then there are

the last words of “the good thief” in

today’s gospel: “Jesus, remember me

when you come into your kingdom.”

Jesus’ comforting response to him

and to all those who ask for God’s

mercy are his words: “This day you

will be with me in paradise.”

And what were some of Jesus’ other

last words before his death? “Father, for-

give them for they know not what

they are doing.” “Father, into your

hands I commend my spirit.”

## Pastor's Message continued from page one:

The ancient world valued integrity. They were aware that people who talked a noble game might not have a noble game in their heart. So, there was a discrepancy between thinking and saying. There could also be a discrepancy between saying and doing. The way to unmask these possible hypocrisies was to bring onto the stage that great persuader of truth: death.

The death of Jesus makes clear his integrity. What he said and what he did were of one piece. He did not seek out death; but he died as a witness, one who valued God's will more highly than his own life. He taught and lived a non-violent way of life, holding forgiveness and reconciliation to be absolute values that had to be followed at all costs. When pressure was brought against him to abandon those values and use whatever powers he had to protect himself and defeat his attackers, he refused to do so. He died as he lived. This simply yet profound integrity lifts him above others and recommends his revelation of a forgiving God as truthful. . .something we can believe in.


On this last Sunday of our liturgical year, we are welcomed to the kingdom of Christ: a place where compassion is the rule of law and where justice is the coin of the realm. Jesus on the cross, dying between two thieves, offering mercy and forgiveness with his last breath—this is the kingdom of God. We find the kingdom of God, we find this Jesus, reigning in every act of selfless kindness and compassionate understanding. We find the kingdom of God in every form of charity and outreach—when we feed a family at Christmas and Easter, when we share God's bounty, when we share our bread and our companionship with those who are hungry for food and acceptance. We find the kingdom of God in every hand extended to the poor, in helping those who are stumbling to stand up straight and start again, in seeking out the lost and welcoming them back into our community.

The kingdom of God knows neither boundaries nor walls, neither castes nor classes. Christ the King's rule is one of humble service. Christ the King's power is compassion, and his scepter is humility. Christ the King's court belongs to the poor, the forgotten, the lost and despairing. The coin of the realm in the kingdom of Christ is forgiveness and reconciliation. May our own imitation of

Christ's compassionate servanthood and humble generosity to all make us worthy to be citizens of his eternal kingdom. May we so live in this life that we may say with "the good thief," at the end of our life, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." And may we hear Christ say to us, "This day you will be with me in paradise."

*November – the virtue of Generosity: The Call of the King*

*“Whoever wishes to come with me must labor with me.” Spiritual Exercise 95*

This is the month where we express thanksgiving, where we express gratitude. Last August, we explored the virtue of Gratitude:

*Gratitude is at the heart of the Spiritual Exercises-Ignatius asks us to ponder a Creator who created us out of love and who continues to create us each moment of our lives. Gratitude is intentional – perhaps we could see each day as a gift from a loving Creator, who desires to gift us and love us each day. Gratitude is a virtue that needs attention, so that we may remember the gift, as well as the giver and open our hearts in love and generosity.*

Ignatius realized that when we develop and “exercise” the virtue of gratitude, we begin to live our lives with an attitude of abundance rather than scarcity.
