Wisdom from the Pews

It was the week before Christmas and I was looking forward to flying to Spokane and celebrating the holidays with my family. While there, I wanted to look up some old friends, spend some quality time with my parents and siblings, and get some much-needed rest from my teaching job. I also wanted to visit my uncle, a priest who lived at Jesuit House on the Gonzaga University Campus. He had terminal cancer and so it was imperative that I see him soon.

He was happy to see me and we visited as we used to do. He appeared able bodied and even jovial. Except for a yellowish pallor to his skin, I might not have known that he had cancer. In the course of our conversation, he told me that he was having trouble sleeping because he had such terrible back pain. He was not quite sure what to do about it. I made a mental note of this and decided I would look for a mattress-sized heating pad for him while I was Christmas shopping downtown. Surely that would help him. J. C. Penny's had the heating pad I needed so I made my purchase and headed back to Gonzaga. This time, though. I would not be able to stop and visit but instead, would have to drop the package off and have someone give it to him.

I rang the bell and a kindly old priest came to the door. I told him that I wanted to drop off an electric mattress pad for my uncle and would he please give it to him? He agreed to make sure my uncle got the heating pad. I thanked him and then left.

A couple of hours later, I realized that

I had not heard from my uncle. Surely he would have called to say that he had received the blanket. I then decided to call him. When he heard that I had given the package to the kindly old priest, he said "Oh no! He has Alzheimer's! I will need to enlist some people to help me find it."

About an hour later, my uncle called back. "We found the package," he said. The kindly old priest had taken the blanket into the Jesuit House Chapel and there, nestled it in the hav of the manger and laid it to rest at the feet of the Baby Jesus.

The following year, on May 19, 1998, my uncle passed away. I will never forget his kindly ways, his prayerfulness, his courage, and the story he gave me to share with others. And I will always remember the humble little priest whose first thought was to leave a warm blanket at the feet of the Baby Jesus. The priest's actions prompted me to ask myself this question: What gift shall I lav at the feet of Jesus?



I write this reflection knowing that many of you will read it on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Christmas falls on Thursday this year so it's not too early for me to wish you, Merry Christmas!

The message of the angels to shepherds, in the fields of Bethlehem, is still Good News for all those who can hear it and give it a place in their hearts, their lives, and their world. "For today, in the city of David, a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord."

Mary Oliver, in her poem "Mysteries, Yes," names what this Christmas event is all about. "Truly, we live with mysteries too marvelous to be understood." So: what mysteries will you and your family and friends celebrate this Christmas? Will you celebrate the fact that God in Christ is Emmanuel (Godwith-us) in people and experiences we do not fully understand? Will vou celebrate that God in Jesus has saved us? Saved us from despair by being hope. Saved us from darkness by being light. Saved us from death by being life. Saved us from isolation by inviting us into community. Mysteries are meant to be pondered. During this Christmas Season, may we all find time to ponder the incredible gift that God in Christ saves us.

If you do set aside time to ponder on these mysteries, you may want to light a candle. Poet and civil rights leader Howard Thurman recommends that we light candles this Christmas:

I will light Candles this Christmas, Candles of joy despite all the sadness,

Candles of hope where despair keeps watch,

Candles of courage for fears ever present, Candles of peace for tempest-tossed days, Candles of grace to ease heavy burdens, Candles of love to inspire all my living, Candles that will burn all year long. When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home,

When the shepherds are back with their flock,

The work of Christmas begins: To find the lost, To heal the broken,

To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,
To bring peace among others,
To make music in the heart.

This Christmas I will light a candle to acknowledge how God is with us in this St. Ignatius community. I will light a candle because Christ the Light has come to the world and as the evangelist John reminds us at Mass on Christmas Day, "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." I will light a candle in gratitude for how each of you bring your light to shine through your prayerful presence at Mass and your generous response to the broader community in need. I will light a candle that we will be united in heart and mind and effort as we continue the real work of Christmas in our homes, our city, our country and our world in the new year.

From the entire St. Ignatius parish staff, may the blessings of Christmas be yours in abundance.

If you are age 73 or older, the IRS requires you to take required minimum distributions each year from your taxdeferred retirement accounts. A qualified charitable donation (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable directly to a qualified charity such as St. Ignatius Parish. As 2025 draws to a close, please consider making a year-end donation to help us maintain and care for our beautiful church. A charitable IRA rollover is an easy way to make a gift to St. Ignatius Parish to help us grow our endowment.

You can directly transfer any amount up to \$100,000 from your IRA and pay no income tax on the distribution, while making a charitable donation to our parish.


