## Wisdom from the Pews

"Do not forget the works of the Lord!" (Psalm 78:7b)

A call to remember during times of trial.

An offering made in suffering.

A reminder to give glory to God when life reaches its peak, filled with success and recognition.

For all that is good flows from the One who knows suffering firsthand - on the Cross.



Challenges are never easy to endure. So much so that, before we even try to grow through them, our first instinct is often to ask God to remove them from our path. Many times, God meets that request with silence. Silence can stir doubt, increase frustration, and even lead to hopelessness. In our limited capacity to make sense of our struggles, prayers can turn into constant complaints. Yet, the more I complained, the more I

found myself spending time with God—until I eventually recognized that God's silence was not a sign of absence but an invitation to draw closer. Silence communicates God's abiding presence—the One who is always there, incredibly patient, and listening to every word I speak. We encounter a God who listens with a loving heart, who embraces our fears and doubts, transforming them into a deeper relationship—a bond between an understanding Father and a struggling child learning to trust.

God's silence carries a profound message. It invites us to take time—time to pause and reflect on our suffering in light of Christ's crucifixion. In this sacred space of silence, we are drawn into union with Jesus. We unite with the Crucified Christ the moment we let go of our pride before His humility—He who. though divine, emptied Himself for our sake-and surrender our circumstances, however hard, into His hands. By recognizing our limitations, we touch Jesus' wounds the wounds that bore the weight of our sins. In longing for the healing and sanctification that flow from His Blood and Water, we come to realize that God's love overflows in every aspect of our lives—during moments of delight and in times of darkness. It is the love of a compassionate and merciful Father for an unworthy child slowly learning to follow.

God's love invites us into a spirit of gratitude. Whether in joy or challenge, every moment of our lives holds meaning and purpose in glorifying God. In these moments, we begin to see more clearly the unfolding work of God throughout our journey. To the One who guides us every step of the way, we are grateful.

### "Do not forget the works of the Lord!" (Psalm 78:7b).


The works that reveal to us the true meaning of our lives as children of God.
