## A Message from the Pastor

A strange thing happened to me on the way to creating Bulletin Message about our gospel story from Luke—"The Healing of the Ten Lepers." I wanted to share some of Anne Lamott's wisdom from her book *Help! Thanks! Wow! The Three Essential Prayers*. In our gospel story, Jesus talks about thanksgiving and gratitude. For Anne Lamott, that is one of the three essential prayers.

I wanted to share Anne Lamott's take on gratitude—that it begins in the heart and then dovetails into behavior. I wanted to explain how gratitude almost always makes us willing to be of service, which is where the joy resides. Gratitude means we are willing to stop being a jerk. When we are aware of all that has been given to us, in our lifetime and in the past few days, it is hard not to be humbled, and pleased to give back. As Lamott puts it, "You breathe in gratitude, and you breathe it out, too. Once you learn how to do that, then you can bear someone who is unbearable." She quotes the Sufi mystic Rumi who once said, "There are hundreds of ways to kneel and kiss the ground," and bearing the unbearable is one of the best.

So, that was going to be my interpretation of this weekend's gospel until I read a spiritual reflection by Patricia Sanchez entitled "Passionate Gratitude." She did what any good theology does—she turned things upside down, she twisted syntax so that I could view familiar reality freshly. I always thought this was a story about one grateful leper and nine ungrateful lepers. Sanchez reframed the story for me. She sees nine obedient lepers and one disobedient leper. Sanchez quotes Barbara Brown Taylor, who put it this way: "Nine behaved like good lepers, good Jews; only one, a double loser, behaved like a man in love." Professor Taylor explains that she herself knows how to obey. She reads her Bible, she says her prayers,



she financially supports the works of the church like a steady, I aw-abiding disciple. After all, such behaviors have kept the great ship of the church afloat for more than two thousand years. But, says Barbara Brown Taylor, "I do not know how to be in love. I am one of the nine, but I am intrigued by the 10th leper, whose passion is confounding."

Following his heart rather than Jesus' orders, the 10th leper was so driven by the experience of being made whole and free and newly alive that he could not help himself.

## Pastor's Message continued from page one:

He was compelled by such passionate love and gratitude that he had to return to the One who had made it so. This is the same love and gratitude that can drive all of us to return to the great feast of thanksgiving that we call the Eucharist. Gathered together each week, we hear the words of Jesus that challenge us to be healed of our pride, selfishness, anger, apathy, laziness and deceit. We are reminded to serve the needs of others, particularly the poor among us. We eat the bread of life that nourishes us and heals our brokenness. Then we are sent out into the rest of the week to witness to all that we have known in Jesus. We work, we serve, we pray, we love, we remember and give thanks for all God's gifts until we are drawn yet again to give thanks at the Eucharist.

If I asked you what causes you to come back every week and celebrate the Eucharist, how would you respond? Would you say that you come regularly because the church obliges you? Would you say that you are simply obeying the commandment "to keep holy the Sabbath"? Would you say that you simply want to offer a good example to your children or grandchildren?


Some of you would respond that it has simply become a habit—a good habit. Still others look upon this weekly worship as an expression of faith, a spiritual oasis, a place to fuel up for the week ahead. For many of us, the words of Vatican II come to mind: "The liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed and the fount from which all its power flows."

Why do we keep coming back week after week to celebrate the sacred mysteries? How could we stay away? Like Naaman from the first reading and the grateful albeit disobedient leper in our gospel, we have the opportunity at every Eucharistic encounter to be transformed by God and by grace. We are challenged not just to pray, pay, and obey, but to be so in love with

Jesus and so passionate about the Gospel that we cannot help but glorify God, fall at Jesus' feet, and thank him. This is what keeps bringing us back to the One who never stops giving—loving, passionate gratitude. And each time that we return to give thanks, Jesus will assure us, "Stand up and go, your faith has saved you."

*What are the responsibilities of a lector?*

Prayerfully prepare the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> readings for mass; Arrive 15 minutes before mass to make sure the readings and prayers of the faithful are in place at the ambo; At the beginning of mass, process in with the Book of the Gospels and place it on the altar; Proclaim the readings and prayers of the faithful during mass; Process out at the end of mass.
