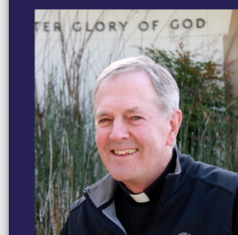

## **In the Breaking of the Bread**

Dear Parishioners:

The gospel for this third Sunday of Easter is about the disciples on the road to Emmaus, how they were sad and discouraged. In the story, the Risen Lord restores their joy when they recognize him "in the breaking of the bread." For us it is ironic that in these days of pandemic, a big heartache is that we are no longer "breaking bread" and receiving Communion.



As you and I celebrate Sunday today, as we reflect with heavy hearts about the bad news that weighs us down, it is much the same for us as for those two on the road to Emmaus. It is good to acknowledge our heavy hearts. It is good to take an inventory of who we are as we walk our road together. In this season of pandemic, how are you doing? What are the feelings in your heart? Pray with me this inventory taken from the inspiration of Father Bill Huebsch.

Who are you? Are you married with kids, worrying for them and committed to their welfare? Are you divorced? Are you married for the second, or even the third time? Are you a single parent struggling to make ends meet, but also hoping to have love in your life again? Are you gay or lesbian? Well if you are, then you belong in this faith community because you belong to Christ. The Good News is that Christ is the One who creates community when he breaks bread, and he welcomes you as part of his Body. The words from the Gospel are addressed to you: They recognized him in the breaking of the bread.

Are you lonely? Are you a widow? Are you a single man or woman who would prefer to have a spouse? Are you disabled or disfigured? Have you run out of luck? Does your life seem flat? Is your faith on a slowdown? Do you worry that this pandemic will keep going on and on, and that it will be slow until there is a "new normal?" Well, if you are, then you belong here because you belong to Christ.

Are you struggling financially? Have you been laid off? Downsized? Does it seem like you can never quite get it all together? Are you frazzled about so much economic insecurity? Are you struggling with family planning questions? Are you trying to conceive, or have you reluctantly ended a pregnancy? Have you been a victim of abuse or violence, of a crime? Are you fearful? Are you guilty of a crime and afraid of being caught? Do you have a past about which you feel shame? Are you homeless or hopeless? Well if so, then you belong here because you belong to Christ.

Are you new here? An immigrant maybe? Are you from another Christian tradition? Are you full of sadness today, like the two on the road to Emmaus? Are you hopeless like they were?

Has it been a while since you darkened the doorway of a faith community? None of that matters. You belong here because you belong to Christ. The Good News is that Christ is the one who breaks bread, and he welcomes you as part of his Body. The words from the Gospel are addressed to you: They recognized him in the breaking of bread.

In these days of quarantine and frequent hand washing and social distancing of six feet and face masks and suspension of church attendance, I hear your acute desire to receive Christ in the Eucharist. There is a parish phone tree currently operating called "Resurrection Outreach." Staff and various parishioners are phoning everyone on our church and school roster to check in and see how they are doing. One of the feelings I hear most frequently is how much you miss seeing everyone at Mass and receiving the Eucharist. The two are connected. Relating to the Body of Christ means both seeing one another at church, and receiving Communion.

If you would like to take part in the phone tree, call Joseph Byrd at 503 777 1491, and Joseph will give you some phone numbers to call. As the weeks unfold on our road ahead, let's keep longing for the day when we will be in full Communion as the Body of Christ once again.

## FAMILY LIFE ~ BETH SCHALLER

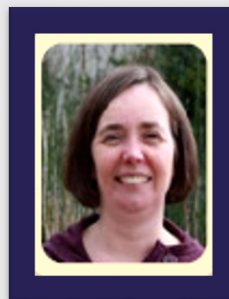

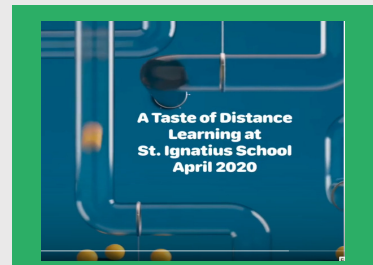


## SCHOOL NEWS

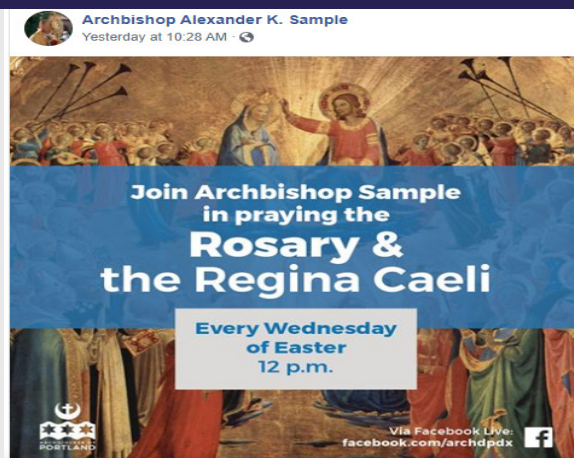

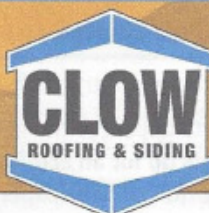
